³ Because this is an entitlement program, its annual funding is automatically set at the level required to fund the services authorized for eligible persons. Statutory changes in eligibility or benefit levels, as well as changes in the number of eligible persons participating, affect federal outlays.

⁴ Funds from this program are drawn from the overall appropriations for Section 8 low-income rental assistance.

⁵ Funds within the Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention accounts are proposed to be combined and transferred to a new flexible grant program, the Child Safety and Juvenile Justice Grant Program.
