As Executive Director of the National Employment Law Project, and in her decades as a workers' rights advocate, Chris has fought tirelessly to ensure that low-income workers are able to provide for their families, and receive fair and equitable treatment in the workplace. She led a successful coalition to raise the minimum wage in 1996 through the Workers Options Resource Center and the Citizens Committee for a Fair Minimum wage. At the AFL-CIO for nearly a decade, Chris led the federation's policy work around efforts to strengthen worker protections under federal and state law, expand unemployment assistance, and promote equality for working women. Under Chris' leadership since 2008, NELP has worked successfully for historic expansions of unemployment benefits to respond to the very deep recession.
