



Poverty Increases in 2003

Poverty is increasing among Americans of all ages.

Poverty has grown among children, too; they remain disproportionately poor.

The vast majority of poor children live in working families.

There are nearly one million more children living below half the poverty line since 2000 – that’s less than about \$7,500 for a three-person family.

There were 580,000 more children living in such extreme poverty in 2003 than in 2002 – a stunningly big increase for just one year.
