Biden American Jobs Plan

- \$621 billion transportation infrastructure (includes \$85 billion for public transit)
- \$400 billion home- and community-based care (Medicaid); extend Money Follows the Person program for innovative long-term care services
- \$300 billion manufacturing and small business
- \$213 billion housing (build, preserve, and retrofit 2 million homes; includes \$40 billion to improve public housing; extend affordable housing rental opportunities to underserved communities; weatherization)
- \$180 billion R&D
- \$111 billion drinking water safety (lead pipe replacement) in residences, schools, child care centers available to tribes, territories, disadvantaged communities
- \$100 billion broadband (rural, underserved urban areas, tribal lands)
- \$100 billion power infrastructure
- \$100 billion upgrade and build public schools
- \$100 billion workforce development aimed at underserved groups, including youth; includes wraparound services, income supports, counseling, case management; includes \$40 billion dislocated workers program; new subsidized jobs program; programs for formerly incarcerated and justice-involved youth; get rid of subminimum wage; 1-2 million apprenticeship slots; worker protections
- \$25 billion child care facilities/increase supply of child care, esp. for infants and toddlers in high need areas
- \$20 billion for new racial equity program for neighborhoods, to ensure new projects increase opportunity, advance racial equity and environmental justice
- \$18 billion VA facilities
- \$12 billion community colleges
- \$10 billion federal buildings
- \$2 trillion in revenue (focused on corporate side; would increase corporate income tax rate to 28% from current 21%; prevent U.S. corporations from claiming international tax havens as their residences)
- Calls for the PRO Act, prevailing wage, labor protections, local hire, registered apprenticeships, Buy America, and increased penalties for workplace safety and health violations.
