Call to Action

Poverty in the U.S. declined in 2015, but there is still more that needs to be done in Maine. In 2015, anti-poverty programs such as the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), low income tax credits, and housing vouchers lifted thousands of Mainers out of poverty.
