



Near and Deep Poverty in New Jersey

200% Poverty Line: Near-poor

50% Poverty Line: Deep Poverty **62%** of households earning less than \$20K/year paid more than half of income on rent

Poverty Line

Over **387,000** New Jerseyans lived in deep poverty in 2017

Working Hard

Struggling folks are working: In fact, in 62.3% of poor families, one or more people worked at least part-time or part of 2017

New Jersey Has Fewer Uninsured Because It Expanded Medicaid


Percentage of people uninsured in 2017

- Refundable tax credits: Earn Income Tax Credit and refundable portion of Child Tax Credit
- SNAP: Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program
- · Housing subsidies: Public housing and tenant vouchers
- SSI: Social Security Insurance
- TANF: Temporary Assistance for Needy Families
